Short Biosketch

Karin B. Michels, ScD, PhD, is Professor and Chair of the Department of Epidemiology at the Fielding School of Public Health at UCLA. She received her doctorate in epidemiology from Harvard University and a doctorate in biostatistics from the University of Cambridge, UK. Dr. Michels' research focuses on the life course interval between conception and puberty as susceptible period for breast cancer initiation. She is also the co-founder of the new field of epigenetic epidemiology and more recently integrated the microbiome into her field of study. Dr. Michels currently serves as P.I. of one of the coveted Breast Cancer and the Environment Research Program (BCERP) U01 grants that are part of the BCERP consortium of NIEHS/NCI. She has authored and co-authored over 250 scientific publications and received funding from the National Institutes of Health, the American Cancer Society, the U.S. Department of Defense, the European Union, and many other organizations.
